In order for a local congregation to become certified as a *Church of Refuge*, it must become a COR network member and effectively incorporate the Nine Values into church ministries.

NINE COR VALUES

SPIRITUAL GROWTH

- 1. Sabbath CORs are committed to providing a meaningful Sabbath experience.
- 2. Discipleship CORs are committed to following Jesus Christ in all areas of life.

RELATIONSHIPS

- 3. Acceptance CORs are committed to accepting people just as Jesus did.
- 4. Community CORs are committed to building a caring and welcoming community.
- 5. Support CORs are committed to supporting youth and young adults with their life challenges.
- COMMUNITY IMPACT

6. Service – CORs are committed to demonstrating God's love through acts of service and evangelism. <u>EMPOWERMENT</u>

- 7. Leadership CORs are committed to senior youth and young adult leadership.
- 8. Budget CORs are committed to investing money in senior youth and young adult ministry.
- 9. Change CORs are committed to change that leads to improved ministry for young people.

CERTIFICATION DETAILS

STEP I: Accept Nomination to form part of COR Network by submitting Application.

STEP II: Prayerfully <u>incorporate the Nine Values</u> into your ministry mix. This process requires time and member involvement. The Certification Guide and online resources will serve to help you.

STEP III: <u>Document your ministry efforts</u>, activities and/or outcomes for Nine COR Values. Demonstrate that you are successfully incorporating the nine principles into your ministry planning and delivery. Submit your report to COR for certification approval.
